Sancta Maria College entered three Transition Year enterprise groups into the Mayo regional competitions. This Year one of our business groups, R.S.G. (Road Safety Girls) set up by four Transition Year girls won 1st prize and claimed a place at the All-Ireland Enterprise final in Tullamore this May. The group designed an Educational Board Game based on road safety. Their intention is to promote the importance of Road Safety through their product, in a fun and educational manner. The Board Game was the main product intended to create a fun way of educating children on the importance of road safety. They also developed a promotional D.V.D. which will be used to inform and highlight important issues regarding road safety to students.

The Transition Year students went on a tour of Castlerea Prison in January. They were given an insight into what life is like behind bars. They also got the opportunity to talk to a prisoner who is serving a life sentence. They toured the prison grounds and had a question and answer time with the prison officers.
